Catholic schools are privately funded by tuition, reducing federal spending by more than \$24 billion annually.

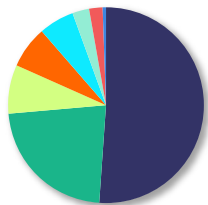
Community Service

SPECIAL NOTE!

The State of Arizona limits the total amount of corporate tax credit dollars that can be used for tuition scholarships, so applications are accepted until the maximum is met. Since 2006, Arizona corporations have had the opportunity to direct their Arizona tax liability in the form of tuition scholarships for underserved youth. Which Corporate Tax Credits are Available?

CREDIT 335 - Low Income Corporate Tax Credit for students whose family income falls within the Federal Poverty Guidelines along with other eligibility criteria.

CREDIT 341 - Disabled/Displaced Corporate Tax Credit for exceptional learners and students that have been placed in the AZ Foster Care system at one time.

Corporate Tax Credits Explained

Who is eligible to participate?

- ✓ C-Corporations
- ✓ S-Corporations
- ✓ LLCs and PLLCs that file their State taxes as a C- or S- Corporation
- ✓ Insurance Companies that pay Premium Tax

No Risk!

If you over-estimate your tax liability, you can carry over the unused credit for up to five additional tax years!

How much of my tax liability can I direct?

You may contribute up to 100% of your corporate state tax liability to CEA on behalf of our General Scholarship Fund or school(s) of your choice.

How it Works

- 1 Complete a Catholic Education Arizona (CEA) Corporate Tax Credit Commitment form and return it to CEA at corporate@ceaz.org.
- 2 CEA will complete the required documentation and submit to the Arizona Department of Revenue (ADOR).
- 3 Upon approval from the ADOR, CEA will notify each corporation. Payment is due to CEA within 20 calendar days following approval.
- 4 Tax Receipt will be sent to your business to be submitted with your tax return as proof of payment.

How are tax credit funds used?

By law, low income corporate tax credit funds are dedicated exclusively to the tuition needs of children living within the poverty guidelines as determined by federal standards. Disabled Displaced funds are distributed to students with an MET, ISP, IEP, 504 plan or students that have at one point been in the Arizona foster care system.
