Thank you for celebrating 25 years of community impact with us for students in the Diocese of Phoenix Catholic Schools!

We are fortunate to call the great state of Arizona home, where parents' ability to determine the educational opportunity that is best suited for their children's needs is supported through the use of the Arizona Individual and Corporate tax credits.

We are pleased to share our FY22 Impact Report ending June 30, 2022. In FY22 we raised \$24.5 million, an increase of \$3 million YOY. In our 25 year history, we have awarded 148,000 scholarships and raised \$313 million dollars since inception.

Fiscal year 2022 was our inaugural year awarding Disabled (exceptional learners) and Displaced (foster children) tax credit scholarships. We awarded 126 scholarships for a total of \$357,812.

Our Revenue Streams Include:

- Individual Tax Credit Contributions
- Corporate Tax Credit Contributions
- Matching Gifts from Corporations
- Individual and Corporate Donations

We are thankful to have committed Associates and Board of Directors who have built a healthy culture of trust, respect and value for one another. This formula creates an environment of innovation, creativity, and inspiration for growth.





SCHOLARSHIPS



HOW ARE SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED?

Catholic Education Arizona partners with an independent, third party to provide an in-depth financial needs analysis of its applicants. For more than 22 years, Financial Aid Independent Review (FAIR) has worked with institutions throughout the nation to calculate tuition scholarships for families. Need is defined in a variety of ways, and not based on income alone.

CEA realizes that there are extenuating circumstances in a family's situation that are not adequately explainable through their tax documentation. CEA and FAIR provide ample opportunity for a family to share circumstances not notable in the application, to help provide a more thorough understanding of the family's ability or inability to help support their tuition obligation.

Families are encouraged to complete a FAIR application beginning February 1st of the year preceding the school year they are applying for and provide required verification documentation y April 15th for consideration for the first ound of scholarship awards.

CEA is the first STO to notify schools and families of their scholarship awards, providing peace of mind and the ability to acquire additional sources of funding if necessary. A second round of funding is released in September for families applying after April 15th, and then a third and final round toward the end of the school year.

INDIVIDUAL CONTRIBUTIONS

HOW IT WORKS

Arizona Law (ARS43-1089) allows taxpayers to direct all or a portion of their state tax liability to certified School Tuition Organizations (STOs) including Catholic Education Arizona (CEA). At CEA, your individual tax credit dollars are used exclusively for tuition scholarships for underserved children enrolled in Catholic Schools within the Diocese of Phoenix, St. Michael's Indian School and Boys Hope Girls Hope of AZ.

- Line 48 of your 2021 AZ 140 or Line 58 of your AZ 140PY
- Tax Return provides your TAX LIABILITY
- TAX LIABILITY is the amount you owe the state of Arizona for the year BEFORE payroll tax withholding. This is the amount you can use as a tax credit, up to the maximum credits allowable.
- For Tax Year 2022, Single filers can contribute up to \$1,243 and Joint filers 2,483. For Tax Year 2023, Single filers can contribute up o \$1,307 and Joint filers \$,609.

HOW IT WORKS

Businesses that file as S- or C- Corpo ations and Insurance Companies that pay premium tax are able to contribute up to 100% of their Arizona tax liability until the maximum set by the state of Arizona is reached. For 2022, The Low Income Corporate Tax Credit allowed is \$142,112,727. The Disabled/Displaced Tax Credit maximum set by the state of Arizona is \$6,000,000.

HOW TO MAKE YOUR CORPORATE CONTRIBUTION

Investing your Corporate tax dollars in quality education is quick and easy:

- Complete a Commitment Form at ceaz.org/corporate or request via email at corporate@ceaz.org.
- You may select the General Scholarship Fund as recipient (serving schools with highest unmet need), or the school(s) of your choice.
- Return the form to corporate@ceaz.org.
- CEA will prepare the documentation for AZDOR and submit. Once approval is received, payment must be made to CEA within 20 calendar days from the date of approval.
- A tax receipt will be issued following payment.

EMPLOYER MATCHING GIFTS

HOW IT WORKS

The State of Arizona allows individual taxpayers the opportunity to redirect a portion of their state tax liability in the form of a tax credit to School Tuition Organizations (STOs) such as Catholic Education Arizona (CEA) for tuition scholarships to private schools. In addition to utilizing individual tax credits, a contributor's employer may match the tax credit contribution as part of their philanthropic efforts. Join our corporate partners who are making an educational difference in the lives of Arizona's children with their matching gifts!

DOUBLE YOUR IMPACT

- Many businesses sponsor matching gift programs that match, dollar for dollar, charitable contributions made by their employees or retirees.


WHAT IMPACT DOES YOUR CONTRIBUTION HAVE?

Tax credit contributors to CEA can be confident their Individual or Corporate Tax Credit dollars will stay at the selected school(s). By investing in education through Catholic Education Arizona, your tax dollars will support the following:

- Stronger workforce
- Healthier families
- Engaged community members and responsible citizens

The Arizona Disabled/Displaced Corporate Tax Credit allows corporations to redirect their Arizona corporate income tax liability to a School Tuition Organization (STO), like Catholic Education Arizona (CEA). The STO will then distribute scholarships to K-12 students who are disabled or to students who are "displaced" as a part of the Arizona foster care system.

For the academic year 2021 - 2022 CEA distributed \$357,812 in scholarship assistance to 126 students who qualified as Disabled/Displaced.



Catholic Education Arizona is an IRS 501(c)(3) nonprofit charitable organization and has never accepted gifts designated for individuals. Per state law, a school tuition organization cannot award, restrict or reserve scholarships solely on the basis of donor recommendation. A taxpayer may not claim a tax credit if the taxpayer agrees to swap donations with another taxpayer to benefit either taxpayer's own dependent.
